

## GENERAL ABSTRACT RULES

All authors are invited to submit an abstract written by the following rules:

- Download and use the **Review Abstract Form** or **Scientific Abstract Form** to write your abstract, depending on the type of paper you will be writing (Review or Scientific). Follow the specific instructions set in the selected form.
1. The abstract's whole text must be in font **Arial**, size **10**.
  2. A **concise summary of the article** should be provided, clearly describing: content, significance, objectives, methodology, findings, and conclusions, preferably without references or abbreviations.
  3. The submitted abstract should ideally contain **no more than 2000 characters** (or 300 words) including spaces, paper titles, author names, addresses, and keywords. The presented abstract text should ideally **NOT be longer than 1 page.**

Definitions:

**Original SCIENTIFIC Abstract** - reports unpublished results of a completed original scientific research by the study's author(s). Experimental data should be presented in a way that enables the reproduction, and verification of analyses and deductions, on which the conclusions are based.

**REVIEW Abstract** - synthesizes, summarizes, analyses, and evaluates published works on a specific topic, as critical surveys of an area in which the author is (preferably) active. By organizing, integrating, and evaluating previously published material, the author of a review article considers the progress of current research toward clarifying a certain problem. Review articles can range from entirely descriptive to highly evaluative.
