

GENERAL ABSTRACT RULES

All authors are invited to submit an abstract written by the following rules:

- Download and use the **Abstract Template** to write your abstract, depending on the type of paper you will be writing (Review or Scientific). Follow the specific instructions explained in the **Review Abstract Rules** or **Scientific Abstract Rules** documents
1. The abstract's whole text must be in font **Arial**, size **10**.
 2. A **concise summary of the article** should be provided, clearly describing: content, significance, objectives, methodology, findings, and conclusions, preferably without references or abbreviations.
 3. The submitted abstract should ideally contain **no more than 2000 characters** (or 300 words) including spaces, paper titles, author names, addresses, and keywords. The presented abstract text should ideally **NOT** be longer than **1 page**.

Definitions:

Original SCIENTIFIC Abstract - reports unpublished results of a completed original scientific research by the study's author(s). Experimental data should be presented in a way that enables the reproduction, and verification of analyses and deductions, on which the conclusions are based.

REVIEW Abstract - synthesizes, summarizes, analyses, and evaluates published works on a specific topic, as critical surveys of an area in which the author is (preferably) active. By organizing, integrating, and evaluating previously published material, the author of a review article considers the progress of current research toward clarifying a certain problem. Review articles can range from entirely descriptive to highly evaluative.
